Journalist: At the start of your hospitalization, your nurse will **review** your **medical history**, medication and treatment plan with you.

Nurse: It's very important to us that you and your advocate know as much as possible about your diagnosis and treatment. Your orientation package has a list of recommended questions to ask your doctor or nurse. If there is anything you don't understand, you don't need to feel **rushed** or embarrassed, just ask again.

Your doctor will be coming to see you **once a day** while you are in the hospital. However, the exact time your doctor visits may change day to day, depending on their **schedule** with other patients. If you do not have a **primary care doctor** or if they are unable to see you at this hospital, another **attending doctor** has been **assigned** to you and will be caring for you while you are at Providence Holy Cross.

And finally, your **physician** has prescribed a **diet** for you based on your **condition**. A nutrition care representative will visit you between the hours of 9 and **noon** to discuss your menu and to review any restriction and allergies with you.
